


Introduction

Interpreting Scores

Scores on Deductive Reasoning are calculated by comparing an individual's score with a large group of people (norm group) who have also completed the same tests. Thus, the results are shaped by a meaningful comparison with others. These are then expressed as 'percentiles' and you can use the below scoring key to benchmark Sam's results:

- Legal and Compliance Analysis: Deductive reasoning is crucial in legal and compliance-related tasks. It helps in interpreting laws, regulations, and contractual agreements, identifying relevant precedents, and drawing logical conclusions from available evidence. It is also useful for evaluating the compliance of actions or decisions with established guidelines and rules.
